RESOLUTION DECLARING INTENT TO PROCEED WITH ELECTION ON THE QUESTION OF RENEWAL OF A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION

(R.C. Sections 5705.21, 5705.25) Renewal Operating Levy

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2019, the Board passed a resolution (the "Resolution of Necessity") declaring the necessity for the purpose of current expenses for the School District, to renew all of an existing tax levy in excess of the ten-mill limitation in the amount of 20.10 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$2.01 for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for a period of five years (the "Renewal Levy"); and

WHEREAS, the County Auditor of Ashland County, Ohio has certified to the Board that the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the Renewal Levy during the first year of collection is \$3,404,486, based on the current tax valuation of the School District of \$212,299,220;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Hillsdale Local School District, Ashland and Wayne Counties, Ohio, two-thirds of all the Board members concurring, that:

- Section 1. The Board desires to proceed with the submission of the question of the Renewal Levy to the electors of the School District.
- <u>Section 2</u>. The question of the Renewal Levy shall be submitted to the electors in the entire territory of the School District at the election to be held on November 5, 2019 (the "Election Date"). All of the territory of the School District is in Ashland and Wayne Counties, Ohio.
 - <u>Section 3</u>. The form of the ballot to be used at said election shall be substantially as follows:

A renewal of a tax for the benefit of the Hillsdale Local School District, Ashland and Wayne Counties, Ohio for the purpose of current operating expenses at a rate not exceeding 20.10 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$2.01 for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for a period of five years, commencing in 2020, first due in calendar year 2021?

FOR THE TAX LEVY
AGAINST THE TAX LEVY

- Section 4. The Treasurer of the Board is hereby directed and shall certify, not later than August 7, 2019 (which date is not less than 90 days prior to the Election Date), to the Ashland County Board of Elections a copy of the Resolution of Necessity and a copy of this resolution, together with the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the Renewal Levy during the first year of collection, based on the current tax valuation of the School District, as estimated by the Ashland County Auditor.
- Section 5. The Treasurer of the Board is hereby directed and shall certify to the Ashland County Board of Elections that the Renewal Levy will be for a period of five years and that the Renewal Levy will be placed upon the tax list and duplicate for the 2020 tax year (commencing in 2020, first due in calendar year 2021), if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
- Section 6. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22.
 - K. Approve the Resolution to Proceed with Renewal Permanent Improvement Levy.

RESOLUTION DECLARING INTENT TO PROCEED WITH ELECTION ON THE QUESTION OF RENEWAL OF A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION

(O.R.C. Sections 5705.03, 5705.21, 5705.25) Renewal Permanent Improvement Levy

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2019, the Board passed a resolution (the "Resolution of Necessity") declaring the necessity to renew all of a tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation in the amount of 1.40 mills for

each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$0.14 for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for a period of five years for the purpose of general permanent improvements (the "Renewal Levy"); and

WHEREAS, the County Auditor of Ashland County, Ohio (the "County Auditor") has certified to the Board that the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the Renewal Levy during the first year of collection is \$174,251, based on the current tax valuation of the School District of \$212,299,220;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Hillsdale Local School District, Ashland and Wayne Counties, Ohio, two-thirds of all of the members elected thereto concurring, that:

- Section 1. The Board desires to proceed with the submission of the question of the Renewal Levy to the electors of the School District.
- Section 2. The question of the Renewal Levy shall be submitted to the electors in the entire territory of the School District at the election to be held therein on November 5, 2019 (the "Election Date"). All of the territory of the School District is in Ashland and Wayne Counties, Ohio.

 Section 3. The form of the ballot to be used at said election shall be substantially as follows:

A renewal of a tax for the benefit of the Hillsdale Local School District for the purpose of general permanent improvements at a rate not exceeding 1.40 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$0.14 for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for 5 years, commencing in 2020, first due in calendar year 2021.

FOR THE TAX LEVY
AGAINST THE TAX LEVY

- Section 4. The Treasurer of the Board is hereby directed and shall certify, not later than August 7, 2019 (which date is not less than 90 days prior to the Election Date), to the Board of Elections of Ashland County, Ohio (the "Board of Elections") a copy of the Resolution of Necessity and a copy of this Resolution together with a copy of the County Auditor's certified estimate of the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the Renewal Levy during the first year of collection, based on the current tax valuation of the School District.
- Section 5. The Treasurer of the Board is hereby directed and shall simultaneously certify to the Board of Elections that the Renewal Levy will be for a period of five years and that the Renewal Levy will include a levy on the tax list and duplicate for the 2020 tax year (commencing in 2020, first due in calendar year 2021), if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
- Section 6. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22.
